

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Advent is a beautiful time. Four weeks to prepare ourselves, four weeks of grace. To help us to get ready, every week, we have a different topic to meditate and reflect.

Last week we talked about the second coming of the Lord. And we emphasized the end of the time. And Jesus reminds us that we need to be prepared because we never know when

the Lord is coming. Today, we shift from the second coming to the first coming of the Lord. The birthday of Jesus. The coming of our savior 2000 years ago and now. For that, there is a story.

There is a story about a parishioner who wanted to know about how to become holy or to get into heaven. This person went to visit their pastor and said: Father, teach me what I need to know to have happy life. I have studied sacred Scriptures, I pray every day, I have studied theology, I have been in holy land, I was raised catholic, but I have not found the answer, please, teach me the way. At this point, the pastor served tea to this guest. He poured his visitor's cup full and then kept on pouring so that the tea began to run over the rim of the cup and across the table until tea was cascading upon the floor. This person watched this until he could no longer restrain himself, "Its full, stop, no more will go in," he cried out. Like this cup, the pastor said, you are full of your own opinions and speculations. How can I show you the way unless you first empty your cup? (Empty yourself.)

How can we welcome Christ, how can we receive God's grace? How can we enter the promised land with Him, if we have no room in our hearts for Him, if we are not prepared? This is Advent. Time to empty ourselves in order to prepare a room in our hearts for Christ. Maybe my heart is full of pride, anger, selfishness; to empty ourselves means to repent. That is why John the Baptist, the voice of Advent calls us to repent, to change direction, and to face a new way of life. My friends, to repent is a change of attitude toward life, and toward the things we think important now. To repent is not saying I am sorry over and over again; to repent is doing things in a new way, a way that allows Christ to enter more deeply into our hearts. To repent is to be more sensitive to the ways God comes into our lives all year long.

I encourage you to look at the Sacrament of Penance (Confession). When John the Baptist said, Repent and prepare the way of the Lord, people flocked to the Jordan river to be forgiven. The Sacrament of Penance can do the same thing. Review the below Advent calendar for opportunities to celebrate the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confession. If you say you are sorry for your sins, prove it, and come to the Sacraments Penance and Holy Eucharist; if you say you welcome the Christ Child this Christmas, show it by your works of charity and love. My friends, let us ask God for the grace to repent and empty ourselves in order to welcome Jesus in our hearts.

What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is "help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship." (William A. Barry and William J. Connolly, The Practice of Spiritual Direction)

Spiritual direction focuses on religious experience. It is concerned with a person's actual experience of a relationship with God.


Spiritual direction is about a relationship. The religious experience is not isolated, nor does it consist of extraordinary events. It is what happens in an ongoing relationship between the person and God. Most often this is a relationship that is experienced in prayer.

Spiritual direction is a relationship that is going somewhere. God is leading the person to deeper faith and more generous service. The spiritual director asks not

just "what is happening?" but "what is moving forward?"

The real spiritual director is God. God touches the human heart directly. The human spiritual director does not "direct" in the sense of giving advice and solving problems. Rather, the director helps a person respond to God's invitation to a deeper relationship.

#11: "Seasonal Music & Mass Settings"

And so it begins...
YES, the Christmas Music was already playing on the radio two weeks before Thanksgiving!

The Church Year begins anew with the Season of Advent, the four weeks of joyful anticipation and prayer that leads us to the celebration of the Incarnation at Christmas. During the season of Advent, I will introduce one new hymn and because we only can use it during that four week time period I repeat it from Sunday to Sunday so that we can truly learn the melody and be able to add another song to the repertoire to the Parish Music repertoire. I generally (and I have already done so the past few weeks) play the new music instrumentally for at least 3 weeks before I plan on singing it with the parish. Then the week before, (as we did last week) either the choir or cantor will sing it as a prelude before Mass so everyone has a chance to hear it before we actually incorporate it within the season.

Many of us know tons of Christmas songs and tunes and it's probably because they are now playing non-stop and repeating on the radio stations, the stores, everywhere! As I began teaching the kids choir two years ago some music for Christmas Eve Mass I was a bit taken back...they didn't know the RELIGIOUS Christmas Music. So I did an an experiment and played

back...they didn't know the RELIGIOUS Christmas Music. So I did an an experiment and played "Rudolph"....well you can imagine they nearly blew the roof off singing that one. BUT now, going on my third Christmas with the Parish the kids are finally singing the religious songs robustly too!

And now in November, I will begin the Lent/Holy Week Music with the choirs (especially early this year because Easter is March 31, 2024!) Ash Wednesday this year is February 14th and so like Advent I will introduce one new hymn into the Lenten repertoire. And the same for the Easter season.

During Ordinary Time (since it's a longer stretch of time) I have the opportunity to introduce at least 6 -8 new hymns within the Liturgical Year. I will generally do this in the same fashion of playing it instrumentally weeks before we actually use the song, and again will sometimes even have the choir sing it alone at Offertory Time so that everyone can not only listen to the melody but silently pray and meditate on the words.

In Church Music, we also have something known as Mass Settings. These are the acclamations such as the Gloria, Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia) Holy Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Great Amen, Our Father, and the Lamb Of God. Here at SKD when I started in 2021 we were singing "Mass of Renewal." That summer (2022) I began teaching /using the Mass of "Sing Praise And Thanksgiving" (the one we're singing now again, written by Michael Joncas the same composers as "On Eagles Wings.") This past summer (2023) I introduced the "Millennium Mass" a setting that I composed. We printed the melody lines in the parish bulletin as this is easier when learning a new melody. I specifically started it then so that everyone could clearly hear the melody line and learn it over the summer with me as the choirs were on summer recess. Then when the choirs returned we added the four-part harmonies without anyone losing the melody. I generally keep a Mass Setting for a couple months. We will change it out in Lent with Latin Chant (Sanctus. Agnus Dei) and the Mass of Creation, and then for Holy Week return to the mass of "Sing Praise and Thanksgiving. Again by rotation and repetition we begin owning the new melodies to these prayers. And, because I always plan out an entire year this summer we will explore a new setting for 2024.

Thanks for taking the time to read this column each week. It is my hope to just share how and what I do as the Music Director. I've been a Music Director in various churches for almost 35 years and I love my vocation as a Music Minister. My greatest joy is being able to share the gifts and talents God has given me with you. Thank you SKD for continuing to sing, pray and encourage my music ministry with you!
