First Sunday of Advent - 2024



Dear Parishioners and Friends:

As we enter the sacred season of Advent, we are invited to prepare our hearts and souls for the coming of our Lord, Jesus Christ, at Christmas. As we reflect on our lives and prepare for the coming of Christ, we are reminded that His mercy is always available to us. Confession is not just about acknowledging our sins, but about receiving the forgiveness and healing that Christ offers. It is a beautiful opportunity to be reconciled to God and to one another, restoring our hearts and souls to a state of grace.

I encourage all of you to take time during this Advent season to participate in the sacrament of Reconciliation. Whether it's been a long time since your last confession or you go regularly, this sacrament of healing is a gift of great peace and grace. It allows us to prepare our hearts to welcome Christ into our lives more fully.

As we journey through Advent together, let us make the effort to be more intentional about prayer, repentance, and reconciliation, so that we may celebrate the birth of Jesus with hearts that are open, joyful, and renewed in His love.

May this Advent be a time of true transformation, as we prepare to meet the Lord who comes to us, not just in the manger, but in the depths of our hearts.
