

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Advent is a beautiful time. Four weeks to prepare ourselves, four weeks of grace. To help us to get ready, every week, we have a different topic to meditate and reflect.

Last week we talked about the second coming of the Lord. And we emphasized the end of the time. And Jesus reminds us that we need to be prepared because we never know when

the Lord is coming. Today, we shift from the second coming to the first coming of the Lord. The birthday of Jesus. The coming of our savior 2000 years ago and now. For that, there is a story.

There is a story about a parishioner who wanted to know about how to become holy or to get into heaven. This person went to visit their pastor and said: Father, teach me what I need to know to have happy life. I have studied sacred Scriptures, I pray every day, I have studied theology, I have been in holy land, I was raised catholic, but I have not found the answer, please, teach me the way. At this point, the pastor served tea to this guest. He poured his visitor's cup full and then kept on pouring so that the tea began to run over the rim of the cup and across the table until tea was cascading upon the floor. This person watched this until he could no longer restrain himself, "Its full, stop, no more will go in," he cried out. Like this cup, the pastor said, you are full of your own opinions and speculations. How can I show you the way unless you first empty your cup? (Empty yourself.)

How can we welcome Christ, how can we receive God's grace? How can we enter the promised land with Him, if we have no room in our hearts for Him, if we are not prepared? This is Advent. Time to empty ourselves in order to prepare a room in our hearts for Christ. Maybe my heart is full of pride, anger, selfishness; to empty ourselves means to repent. That is why John the Baptist, the voice of Advent calls us to repent, to change direction, and to face a new way of life. My friends, to repent is a change of attitude toward life, and toward the things we think important now. To repent is not saying I am sorry over and over again; to repent is doing things in a new way, a way that allows Christ to enter more deeply into our hearts. To repent is to be more sensitive to the ways God comes into our lives all year long.

I encourage you to look at the Sacrament of Penance (Confession). When John the Baptist said, Repent and prepare the way of the Lord, people flocked to the Jordan river to be forgiven. The Sacrament of Penance can do the same thing. Review the below Advent calendar for opportunities to celebrate the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confession. If you say you are sorry for your sins, prove it, and come to the Sacraments Penance and Holy Eucharist; if you say you welcome the Christ Child this Christmas, show it by your works of charity and love. My friends, let us ask God for the grace to repent and empty ourselves in order to welcome Jesus in our hearts.

What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is "help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship." (William A. Barry and William J. Connolly, *The Practice of Spiritual Direction*)

Spiritual direction focuses on religious experience. It is concerned with a person's actual experience of a relationship with God. **Spiritual direction is about a relationship.** The religious experience is not isolated, nor does it consist of extraordinary events. It

- is what happens in an ongoing relationship between the person and God. Most often this is a relationship that is experienced in prayer.
- **Spiritual direction is a relationship that is going somewhere.** God is leading the person to deeper faith and more generous service. The spiritual director asks not just "what is happening?" but "what is moving forward?"
- The real spiritual director is God. God touches the human heart directly. The human spiritual director does not "direct" in the sense of giving advice and solving problems. Rather, the director helps a person respond to God's invitation to a deeper relationship.

#12: "The Communion Antiphon"

While the Priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion Chant is begun, it's purpose being to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of unity of their voices, to show

gladness of heart and to bring out more clearly the "communitarian" character of the procession to receive the Eucharist. The singing is prolonged for as long as the Sacrament is being administered to the faithful. (G.I.R.M. #86)

In the Diocese of the United States of America there are four options for singing at Communion:

•The Antiphon from the Missal or the antiphon with its Psalm from the Graduale Romanum.

- •The Antiphon with Psalm from the Graduale Simplex of the liturgical time.
- A chant from another collection of Psalms and Antiphons arranged in responsorial metrical forms.

•Some other suitable liturgical chant (song) approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop. This is sung either by the choir alone or by the choir with the people. (G.I.R.M. #87)

There are many beautiful Eucharistic songs/hymns of both traditional and contemporary style that are suitable to be sung during the Communion Rite. However, as the G.I.R.M. states: "The Communion Chant" meaning one chant/song or refrain should accompany the entire Rite of Communion and be sustained until all the faithful have received. Even if all of the verses have been sung, I will generally have the choir or cantor offer other verses but after each return to the common refrain of the Communion Hymn Antiphon.

One of the benefits of having the words projected on the Church walls is so that while in procession you can add your voice to the singing of the Communion Antiphon. I will generally conclude the Communion Antiphon/Hymn once the Priest as returned the Blessed Sacrament to the Tabernacle and the doors are shut.

You may have noticed that during Ordinary Time, unless we were celebrating a Feast, I suspended a song after communion so that the faithful may have a few moments of sacred silence to reflect/mediate and offer a silent prayer of thanksgiving for receiving the Holy Eucharist.

During certain seasons of the Liturgical Year (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter) we will have that moment of silence once the Tabernacle doors are closed and then offer a Hymn of Praise by the entire assembly, again in thanksgiving for the gift of the Holy Eucharist.





Rosary for Life

Here in Cape Coral, we modified this tradition into only one day focused to the original objective of the celebration.


