

PRAYER: Changes our relationship to God. Through prayer, we admit our need for a power that is greater than ourselves. We acknowledge our limitations and let go of the drive to control everything. In the process, we open ourselves to all that God has to offer us.



WHAT'S WITH THE VEILED STATUES?

We all own or possess something precious or priceless in our lives. For some, it may be a piece of jewelry, an antique, a car, or even something simple as a card from a loved one now gone. In any event, we tend to protect and treasure these items and tend to store them or even wrap them tenderly so that we have them for years to come.

In the church, we too have some precious items that adorn the sacred space. In many churches stained glass windows, stations of the cross and yes, statues or sacred images of saints, the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Joseph, and Christ Himself can help us focus deeper in our Faith.

For those who have vacation homes it may be custom to **cover** things before you leave for the last time. As you look around the house and everything is **covered** it can be sad, so final, and maybe gloomy as you realize things are coming to an end for another year but only for awhile because you're coming back.

The rubrics can guide us. In the *Roman Missal* we find the instruction, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from the Fifth Sunday of Lent may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

The Church uses veils to produce a heightened sense of anticipation for Easter Sunday. This is further actualized when you attend daily Mass and see the veils each day. You don't want them to be there because they are hiding some very beautiful images. And therein lies the whole point: **the veils are not meant to be there forever**. The images need to be unveiled; it is unnatural for them to be covered. The unveiling before the Easter Vigil is a great reminder of our own life on earth. We live in a "veiled" world, in exile from our true home. It is only through our own death that the veil is lifted and we are finally able to see the beauty of everything in our lives.

The beauty of Easter is **unveiled** when we walk into the Church that Sunday morning. The statues are uncovered, the sanctuary is resplendent, filled will flowers and colors in celebration of the Resurrection. The organ, trumpets, bells and voices of the choir and assembly are all jubilantly announcing Jesus' triumph over death!

Now is the time to sit with the family and **unveil** your plans for Holy Week and Easter. Please be sure to join the Parish Family at all of the Holy Week celebrations and Easter too! It's only a week away!

The Basics of LENI

Lent is the annual preparation for Easter observance calling us to reform our lives and to open our hearts to the spiritual blessings God has promised to bestow on us. Lent begins Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday evening when the Triduum begins.



According to the Church's Canon Law, all healthy Catholics from age 18 to 59 are required to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and to abstain from meat on all other Fridays of Lent. Youth 14 and older are also to abstain from meat on those days. "Fasting" means that no more than one main meal is eaten daily, while in the same day no more than two partial meals are eaten which together don't equal the one main meal.

What Should Do?

Take the necessary steps to get yourself on the road to conversion and spiritual renewal. To help you do this, the three main Lenten disciplines urged are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We are invited during Lent to practice these disciplines often. But these aren't just chores we must do because the Church strongly urges them; they are above all opportunities to grow in faith and in love for God.

Why Prayer, Fasting and Alms?

The Lenten basic practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving are rooted in Jesus' original guidance about how to be his disciples that we find in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7). The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1966-1972) also reminds <u>us</u> that Jesus here outlines for us the new law which, if we embrace and implement it, will lead us more surely to the interior renewal and growth in holliness and perfection that Jesus expects of us as his disciples.

Should | Set | enten Goals?

Absolutely! Reflect prayerfully about your Lenten resolutions before making them. Then make yourself a list, But be modest. You may be setting yourself up for disappointment if you set unrealistic goals. And doing a little with love and devotion is spiritually more beneficial than trying to do much but doing it halfheartedly.

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fasting and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are all three traditional disciplines of Lent. The Faithful, the Elect and those Candidates preparing for Reception into Full Communion in the Catholic Church should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.




