

# What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is "help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship." (William A. Barry and William J. Connolly, *The Pra ce of Spiritual Dir on*)

**Spiritual direction focuses on religious experience.** It is concerned with a person's actual experience of a relationship with God.

**Spiritual direction is about a relationship.** The religious experience is not isolated, nor does it consist of extraordinary events. It is what happens in an ongoing relationship between the person and God. Most often this is a relationship that is experienced in prayer.

**Spiritual direction is a relationship that is going somewhere.** God is leading the person to deeper faith and more generous service. The spiritual director asks not just "what is happening?" but "what is moving forward?"

**The real spiritual director is God.** God touches the human heart directly. The human spiritual director does not "direct" in the sense of giving advice and solving problems. Rather, the director helps a person respond to God's invitation to a deeper relationship. Learn more by contacting:

# THE ABORTION AMENDMENT IT'S NOT WHAT IT SEEMS - AND IT'S WAY TOO EXTREME.

TITLE: Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion

So. this amendment eliminates all limitations and regulations on abortion – even safety regulations – that protect women

Not defined anywhere in the amendment.

Wow...ong "healthcare provider" - NOT just doctors - could determine viability or exceptions for "patient's health.".It could even be a nonmedical staff member at an abortion clinic.... BIG loophole makes limitation meaningless. SUMMARY: No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion before viability or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider. This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to

<u>a parent</u> or guardian before a minor has an abortion. Should say: "Amendment to legalize full-term abortion for any age without parental consent in Florida"

Also not defined even "mental stress" could quality for the "patient's health" exception. <u>BIG</u> LOOPHOLE

ELIMINATES CURRENT PARENTAL CONSENT LAWS - So, parents would be told their daughter is guing to have an abortion, but unlike every other medical procedure would not have to give their consent beforehand.

**Rites, Rubrics and Rituals...** of the Catholic Church help us to not only maintain the dignity and reverence of our Faith but are there especially to guide, direct and prepare the faithful when celebrating the Holy Mass.

Every Faith has its way of celebrating some type of Service. As Catholics, our greatest prayer and treasure is the celebration of **Holy Mass.** 

One of the **canons** that is most important is in regards to the faithful **Fasting** before receiving Holy Communion.

That Canon states: A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at *least* one hour before holy communion from ANY food and drink, except for only water and medicine. (Canon 919)

The most current promulgation of **Canon 919** is from 1983, where Saint Pope John Paul II gave us the current law: The phrase "at least one hour" indicates that this is the **bare minimum, and devo-tion to Our Lord** in the Blessed Sacrament (Communion) may of course prompt us to fast for an even longer period if we choose to do so.

**NOTE:** The canon specifies "one hour before Communion, **not** one hour before Mass begins.

While the canon doesn't mention it, the medicine doesn't need to be prescription. Over-the-counter medications can be taken too.

**Bread, Bakery and Beverages...** We are **very blest** at Saint Katharine Drexel to have an abundance of free bread and bakery available to anyone who wishes to take it.

Several months ago it had been relocated to the vestibule of the Parish Hall.

One of the reasons...**Not because** folks were taking it into the pews to take home... **But because some** were actually eating it during the Mass and thus breaking the fast not to mention leaving a mess behind of crumbs and debris.

Sports drinks, soda bottles, and coffee cups have also been found under the pews. Drinks too, **should not** be taken into the **Church proper** especially at Mass. Obviously, if for medical reasons, a sip of water is needed one might have a water bottle with them. If you do, kindly take it with you when leaving.

Just some "Food" for thought.

# Saint Katharine Drexel Traveling Chalice

The purpose of the Traveling Chalice is to encourage families to pray for vocations and to promote vocations within their own families during the Eucharistic revival. Each week one family, couple, or individual will be entrusted to take the chalice home as tangible aids for their prayer. We are hoping to have a different family/individual participate each week.

A vocation is a calling from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured in prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to the Father those men and women whom He is calling to serve Him and others in a very special way. *Maybe He is calling you.* 

#### HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS:

- To sign-up call Sandy Wilkin at (239) 707-9485 or submit the detachable form below. All SKD families/individuals are encouraged to participate.
- At each Weekend Mass, after Communion, the priest calls forward the family/individual that is scheduled.
- The priest presents the traveling chalice to family/individual and commissions them to dedicate their prayers that week for vocations.
- 4. The family/individual places the chalice in a place of honor in their home.
- Using the chalice as a focal point, each day that week the family/individual prays for an increase of vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate, and religious life, married life, and the generous single life. (Prayer booklet will be provided.)
- The next Saturday Vigil/Sunday, before Mass, the family returns the case to the sacristy. If for some reason that is not possible, please contact the Parish Office at (239) 283-9501 during business hours (8:30 am to 4:30 pm) for drop-off.
