

What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is "help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship." (William A. Barry and William J. Connolly, *The Practice of Spiritual Direction*)

Spiritual direction focuses on religious experience. It is concerned with a person's actual experience of a relationship with God.

Spiritual direction is about a relationship. The religious experience is not isolated, nor does it consist of extraordinary events. It is what happens in an ongoing relationship between the person and God. Most often this is a relationship that is experienced in prayer.

Spiritual direction is a relationship that is going somewhere. God is leading the person to deeper faith and more generous service. The spiritual director asks not just "what is happening?" but "what is moving forward?"

The real spiritual director is God. God touches the human heart directly. The human spiritual director does not "direct" in the sense of giving advice and solving problems. Rather, the director helps a person respond to God's invitation to a deeper relationship. Learn more by contacting:



FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED

Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine UNREGULATED ABORTION in our state constitution, making Florida one of the MOST PRO-ABORTION states in the nation. The amendment language is MISLEADING, and its proposed outcomes are DANGEROUS.

WHAT IT SAYS

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental *notification* in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental *consent* for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.01114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.

A Capital Campaign will ensure that we are able to fulfill our financial obligations without needing to ask you, our parishioners, to fund each separate expenditure.

Your offering is first and foremost a gift to the Lord. When the people were withholding their offering to God, He told the Prophet Malichi to say to the people, "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it" (Malachi 3:10). This word from God is an invitation to us, to trust that God will throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing on us, that there will not be room for our lives to contain it. Who doesn't want or need that kind of blessing from God? Do we trust God enough to test Him in this? Do I believe that God will fulfill His promise and fill us to the brim with blessings? I do, and I'm asking you to believe in Him too. Why should we not give God an opportunity to bless us?

I would be remiss if I did not express my deepest gratitude for your continued financial support of the Catholic Faith Appeal. Our Catholic Faith Appeal goal for 2024 is \$241,000.00. Pledged to Date is \$237,604.00. Payments to Date total \$194,861.00 (as of August 18, 2024).



Music in the Mass

"Music in the Mass" is going to be a series of articles that will explore, identify and break open the Sacred Music we use within the context of the Holy Mass.

The Roman Catholic Church has a very rich history in its' liturgical music and throughout the centuries we have not only preserved our Catholicity but continue to be blest with new music from new composers of the day.

Music within the Roman Catholic Church has evolved over the years and from it's very roots in Gregorian Chant, which was generally sung in Latin, we are encouraged, even after Vatican II, to continue to use and preserve the use of Latin within the Mass.

This certainly does not limit our prayer forms of music be it, traditional hymnody, contemporary catholic music or even contemplative music in the form of Taizé prayer. However, the **texts** of the music should always be in line with the doctrine of the Catholic Church.

Sometimes we may be listening to a Christian radio station and although the song may be beautiful it may not be in line with our doctrine and for that reason would not be appropriate to be sung during the Catholic Mass. There are two major Catholic Publishers that almost all the churches in the United States look to for it's music. They are GIA (Gregorian Institute of Music) and OCP (Oregon Catholic Press.) These two companies provide us with a vast library of music from Latin chant, to hymns, to contemporary music and all of their hymnals have been approved by the USCCB (United States Council of Catholic Bishops) for use within the Sacred Mass. This ensures that the music we sing is in-line with our beliefs and does not counter or break our doctrine.


The local bishop is the chief liturgist for his Diocese and is responsible for setting the 'norms' for the Diocese he has been entrusted to shepherd by the Holy See (the Pope) so things may be *slightly* different from Diocese to Diocese but the rubrics are clear and consistent in celebrating Mass.

As we profess to be "One Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church", the music we sing at the Mass should be consistent and *generally* familiar so that those who not only gather each week as parish family (parishioners) but those who may be visiting our local parish are able to freely and fully participate in the Sung prayers of the Holy Mass.

It is my hope to continue to share "Music in the Mass" by future articles and "break-open" the various parts of the Mass we sing, their purpose and why we sing them. I will also be sharing the "role" of the Musician, Cantors, Choirs and Ensembles in future articles.

In the meantime, keep singing SKD for as St. Augustine is quoted: "He who sings well prays twice!"


