

Order. Rules we need to be an autonomous organization that will operate, thrive, and grow. And what do we use as a procedural backbone to our meetings? This is our **Parliamentary Authority** - *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, 12th Edition.* Robert's Rules was written for the English Parliament, so we don't need to follow it precisely. It is a strong guide to how we operate. After the Special Rules of Order comes our **Standing Rules**. They are mostly administrative details of the day-to-day functioning of our organization. At the bottom of the ladder is **Custom**—what we have always done. Like Tradition, it started as a necessity and then grew into habit and then became a custom. It is not necessarily what we are instructed to obey. Customs cannot conflict with the written rule. We will be presenting you with a revision to our Bylaws in the February and March meeting. support has helped provide new wells in more than 40 nations around the world, with a goal to drill and establish 350 more this year! In the USA, they have offices in Ft. Worth, Texas. They encompass many other ministires beside clean water: Christmas Smiles (cleft palate), Christmas Shoes (new shoes), Mission Feeding, Rescue LIFE, LIFE Centers (shelters), and General Ministry, Evangelism, and their broadcast vehicle, LIFE Today (TV). 
