

# What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is "help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship." (William A. Barry and William J. Connolly, *The Practice of Spiritual Direction*)

Spiritual direction focuses on religious experience. It is concerned with a person's actual experience of a relationship with God.

**Spiritual direction is about a relationship.** The religious experience is not isolated, nor does it consist of extraordinary events. It is what happens in an ongoing relationship between the person and God. Most often this is a relationship that is experienced in prayer.

**Spiritual direction is a relationship that is going somewhere.** God is leading the person to deeper faith and more generous service. The spiritual director asks not just "what is happening?" but "what is moving forward?"

The real spiritual director is God. God touches the human heart directly. The human spiritual director does not "direct" in the sense of giving advice and solving problems. Rather, the director helps a person respond to God's invitation to a deeper relationship. Learn more by contacting:



# Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older who have not yet one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fasting and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

The Faithful, the Elect and those Candidates preparing for Reception into Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are all three traditional disciplines of Lent. Full Communion in the Catholic Church should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

## HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE IN THE JUBILEE?

Catholics in Southwest Florida can celebrate and participate in the Jubilee by engaging in local Jubilee activities right here in the Diocese of Venice, or making a special pilgrimage to Rome or designated shrine in the United States.

By visiting one of the Pilgrimage Sites in the Diocese and participating in its offerings of Mass, Adoration, Confession, or other activities, one can celebrate the Jubilee, and gain the Jubilee Indulgence.

A variety of other special Jubilee celebration opportunities will be offered throughout the year, which will be regularly updated at **dioceseofvenice.org/jubilee** 

## WHAT IS A JUBILEE INDULGENCE?

An Indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. It does not grant forgiveness - Confession is a necessary part of any Indulgence. The grace received through an Indulgence may be applied to oneself or another who has gone before us.



# FIRST MEET THE USUAL CONDITIONS

- · Be detached from sin and repentant
- · Receive the Sacrament of Penance and Holy Communion
- · Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father

These conditions may be met specifically at a Jubilee Site or at your own Parish but should be done on the same day or within a few days of the act of indulgence.

# THE A PILGRIMAGE

Undertake a Jubilee pilgrimage to one of the 5 designated Jubilee sites in the Diocese of Venice. The person seeking the Jubilee Indulgence must participate in Holy Mass or any of the following: Celebration of the Word of God, Liturgy of the Hours, Way of the Cross, Marian Rosary, or a penitential celebration, which ends with individual Confession.

# OR A PIOUS VISIT

Devoutly visit any Jubilee site and there, for a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic Adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith, and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God.

An Indulgence may be obtained more than once, but only once per day.


Our eighth Feed My Starving Children MobilePack was a huge success. We had over 830 volunteers help pack 194,400 meals. This is enough food to feed 532 children for an entire year. We have now packed almost



1.38 million meals since we started packing in 2016!

Final totals from the donations received at the event are not in, but we met our financial goal of \$54,000 and had enough extra to fund the packing of an additional pallet of food over our original goal of 186,000 meals. Lastly, our canned food drive at the event took in almost 700 pounds of food that was delivered to the Cape Coral Caring Center and an additional 100 pounds for Bootstrap Food Pantry. This was an increase of over 130 pounds from last year.

Thanks again to all who volunteered, donated and prayed for us. This event could not be done without all the incredible volunteers from St. Katharine Drexel.
