

# What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is "help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship." (William A. Barry and William J. Connolly, *The Practice of Spiritual Direction*)

Spiritual direction focuses on religious experience. It is concerned with a person's actual experience of a relationship with God.

**Spiritual direction is about a relationship.** The religious experience is not isolated, nor does it consist of extraordinary events. It is what happens in an ongoing relationship between the person and God. Most often this is a relationship that is experienced in prayer.

**Spiritual direction is a relationship that is going somewhere.** God is leading the person to deeper faith and more generous service. The spiritual director asks not just "what is happening?" but "what is moving forward?"

The real spiritual director is God. God touches the human heart directly. The human spiritual director does not "direct" in the sense of giving advice and solving problems. Rather, the director helps a person respond to God's invitation to a deeper relationship. Learn more by contacting:

# THE WORD IN OUR LIVES:

# FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: FALSE HUMILITY?

There seems to be a lot of rejoicing in today's readings. Isaiah talks about rejoicing with Jerusalem. The Gospel shows the disciples rejoicing when they came back from visiting towns to tell about the Kingdom. St. Paul is happy to be suffering for Christ. So what is the reason for such joy? The readings make clear that it is not a result of our efforts. Isaiah writes that "the Lord's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14). Jesus tells his disciples not to rejoice that they cast out demons, but "because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). In other words, we are to rejoice over all the Lord has done for us, not what we have done for him.

Does that sound like false humility? No; when we do anything for others, we can honestly say that God does the real work. Knowing that frees us from expecting everyone to be happy, everything we do for others to be successful. Instead of being discouraged when we seem to fail, we can trust that God's plan is working in ways we just can't see.

St. Paul has a similar theme in the second reading. You would think he would be proud of all the converts he made, or the people he cured. He boasts only about his suffering because that is how he is most like Jesus. He sees all of his accomplishments as the work of God. All three readings remind us that what changes our lives and changes the world is not how hard we work, or how holy we are; what really makes the difference is how much God loves us. That is the real reason to rejoice.

# THE CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP


Imagine being one of the seventy-two disciples. Like the Twelve before them, these followers were called to go out and prepare the way for Jesus. Though they hadn't received the same authority as the Apostles, Jesus still entrusted them with a mission: "Go into towns with nothing, stay with whoever welcomes you, eat what is given, and tell them about Me."

They may have felt unsure or unworthy, but like the Twelve, they went—humbly trusting in Christ. And they were successful. Jesus, the perfect teacher, was preparing them for the greater mission they would fulfill after His departure, empowered by the Holy Spirit.


When they returned rejoicing, Jesus reminded them: "Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but because your names are written in heaven."

# SAINT BENEDICT, ABBOT (480-547)

It may be hard to relate to someone who chose to live alone in a cave, contemplating God. Yet, some of our deepest spiritual moments may come when we're alone in prayer. Born in central Italy, Benedict and his sister Scholastica were drawn to religious life early on. After spending time as a hermit, Benedict's holiness and wisdom drew followers. To guide them, he envisioned a community where monks and devout laypeople lived in

unity, praying and working together. He built a monastery at Monte Cassino his Rule lives on in the Order of St. and developed a rule centered on prayer, study, work, and communal life under an abbot's guidance. Benedict taught that manual labor was not degrading, but dignified and sanctifying. While his monks fasted and abstained from meat, he discouraged extreme austerity. Eventually, all Western monasticism adopted the Rule of St. Benedict, shaping European

education, art, and literature. Today, Benedict and the Cistercians, St. Benedict is the patron of Monastics, all of Europe, schoolchildren, and those with kidney disease or poisoning. Let us ask for the intercession of this remarkable monk whose holy life and teachings continue to bless the world. -Tami Urcia
