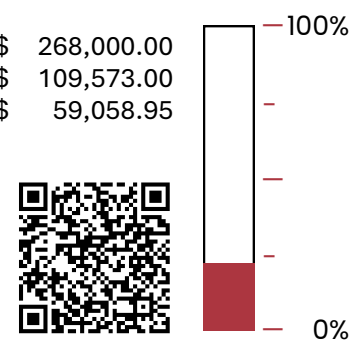

Let us pray that nations move toward effective disarmament, particularly nuclear disarmament, and that world leaders choose the path of dialogue and diplomacy instead of violence.





HOLY WEEK 2026

Dear Parish Family,

Grace and peace to you in our Lord Jesus Christ as we enter the sacred days of Holy Week.

Palm Sunday always moves us deeply. We begin with palms raised high, echoing the cries of "Hosanna!"—and yet, within the same liturgy, we listen to the Passion of our Lord from the

Gospel according to Matthew (27:11–54). We are reminded how quickly shouts of praise can turn into cries of "Crucify him!" The Church, in her wisdom, places both joy and sorrow before us today, inviting us not to look away from either.

Through the prophet Isaiah (50:4–7), we encounter the Suffering Servant—one who listens to God each morning, who speaks a word to the weary, who gives his back to those who beat him and does not shield his face from insult and spitting. "The Lord God is my help," he says, "therefore I am not disgraced." These words find their fulfillment in Jesus. In every moment of rejection and suffering, he remains rooted in trust. He teaches us that faith is not the absence of hardship but steadfast confidence in the Father's presence.

Saint Paul's hymn in Philippians (2:6–11) draws us even deeper into the mystery. Though he was in the form of God, Christ Jesus "emptied himself," taking the form of a slave. He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross. And because of this, God greatly exalted him. This is the pattern of Holy Week: self-giving love that leads to glory. The way down becomes the way up. The cross becomes the throne.

In Matthew's Passion narrative, we stand before Pilate, we witness the mocking, we hear the jeers at the foot of the cross. We listen as Jesus cries out and breathes his last. And then, in a stunning moment of grace, a Roman centurion—an outsider—confesses, "Truly, this was the Son of God." Even in the darkest hour, faith is born.

Holy Week invites us not merely to remember these events but to enter into them. We bring with us our own betrayals, our own moments of weakness, our own suffering and uncertainty. We also bring our love, our desire to follow, our longing for renewal. The liturgies of these days are not performances to observe from a distance; they are sacred encounters that draw us into Christ's saving work.

I warmly encourage you and your families to participate fully in the celebrations of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. Come and watch with the Lord. Come and venerate the cross. Come and renew your baptismal promises. Allow these days to shape your hearts. Bring your children. Let them see and feel the beauty and solemnity of our faith. Holy Week has the power to mark a soul for a lifetime.

If this Lent has been imperfect, do not be discouraged. It is not too late. The Lord's mercy is never exhausted. Stand at the foot of the cross and hear again that his sacrifice is for you. Walk with him through the tomb in trust, knowing that the story does not end there.

Already we anticipate the joy of Easter morning. The One who humbled himself will be exalted. The One who was obedient unto death will rise in glory. And in him, our sorrow will be turned into joy, our sin into forgiveness, our death into life.

May this Holy Week be for each of you a time of grace, reconciliation, and deeper faith. Let us walk together from the waving of palms to the empty tomb, confident that the love revealed on the cross is stronger than sin and death.

PALM SUNDAY

This is the Sunday when the Holy Week begins. Traditionally, Palm Sunday commemorates the Triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem described in all four canonical gospels. It is also called Passion Sunday.

HOLY MONDAY TO SPY WEDNESDAY







MAUNDY THURSDAY

Also called Thursday of Holy Week. The day when the Last Supper is commemorated.

GOOD FRIDAY




Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus and his subsequent death. The cross is the symbol of this day.



HOLY SATURDAY

Also called Black Saturday. Holy Saturday is the day between the crucifixion of Jesus and his resurrection.

EASTER SUNDAY



Easter Sunday is the great feast day and apogee of the Christian liturgical year: on this day the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is celebrated. It is followed by the Easter week.

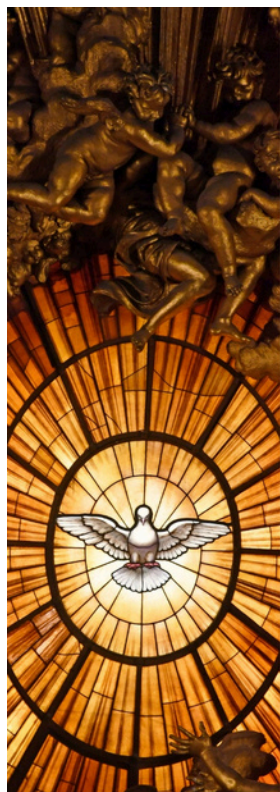

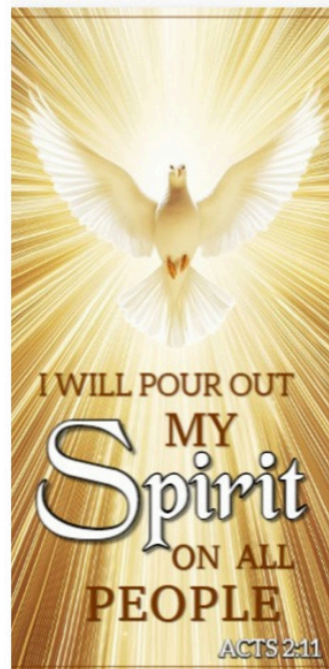


